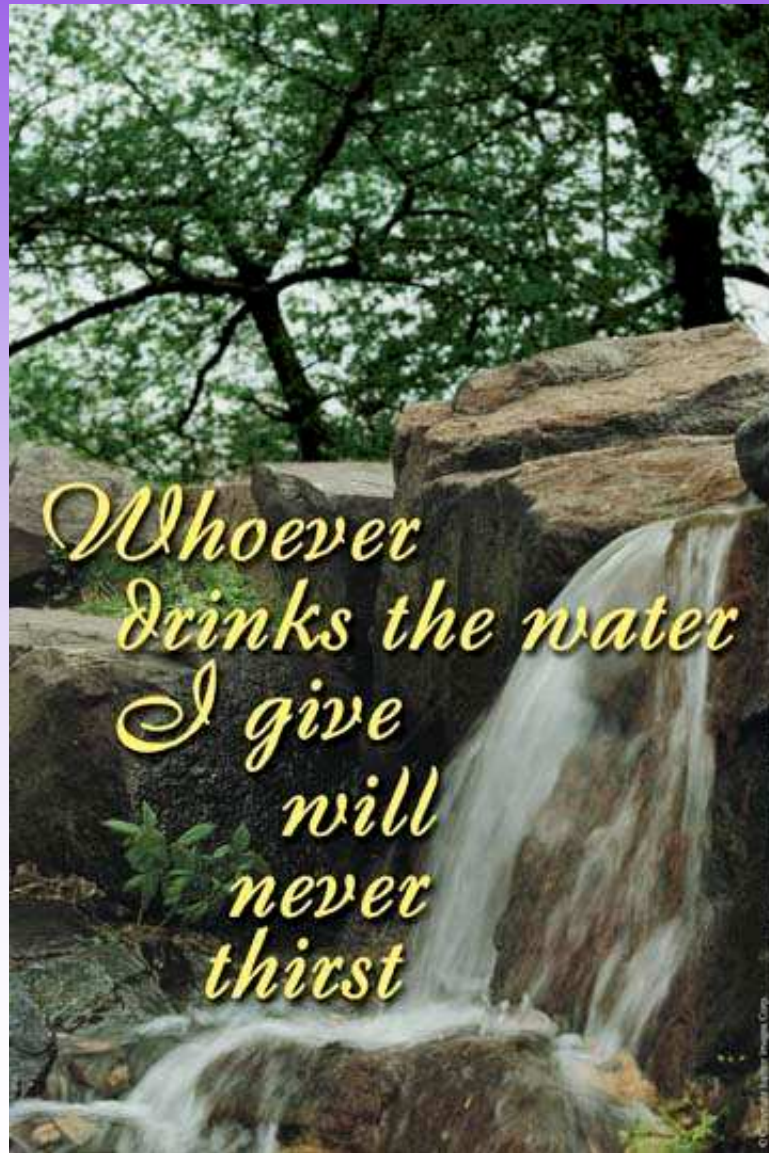

OPERATION RICE BOWL Third Sunday of Lent- Option for the Poor

Jesus guides the Samaritan woman to a greater appreciation of the Truth-Himself. At Mass today, the homilist gave you greater insight into Scripture's message. Education is key to our lives, regardless of our age. Pailash, a young Indian boy stricken with polio, didn't have access to education. He survived by selling newspapers and slept in fear of being robbed. Finally he found safety and opportunity in a Kolkata school for orphans supported by Catholic Relief Services. Today, he eats regular meals, enjoys studying math, and is preparing to learn a useful trade. A fundamental option for the poor is a central tenet of the Church's teachings and mission. CRS helps to expand educational opportunities worldwide, giving new hope to the poor. Your participation in Operation Rice Bowl will make the dreams of young people like Pailash achievable.

A MATTER OF REVERENCE AND RESPECT

There is a very disturbing and unacceptable trend that is being practiced by too many Catholics, including our own parishioners and that is, to leave Mass immediately after receiving Holy Communion. Some people just leave at the start of communion, while others don't even break stride to stop for a moment of thanksgiving and personal reflection, but continue straight out the door while still consuming the Eucharist. This practice of self-dismissal shows a lack of understanding, respect and reverence for the real presence of Christ in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Exceptional circumstances may necessitate leaving early, but approximately one-fourth, of the Congregation at each Mass, each and every Sunday????

Each week we gather as a worshipping community to pray together in song and in word, and in some small way to get to know one another and support each other. This is a wonderful way to begin building an enduring community.

LITURGY'S TEMPTATIONS

Yes, temptation is found everywhere, even in our liturgical gatherings to give worship, praise, and thanks to God. What are some of the temptations that might challenge us during liturgy?

- We might be tempted to come to liturgy totally unprepared in mind and spirit.
- We might be tempted to come to liturgy more interested in greeting friends and neighbors and catching up than in praying and worshiping.
- We might be tempted to come to liturgy and not take sufficient time to calm ourselves down and place ourselves in God's presence.
- We might be tempted not to pick up a hymnal and join our voice with others' in the assembly in praising God.
- We might be tempted to regard liturgy's texts as repetitious and boring rather than make the effort to enter into prayer.
- We might be tempted to criticize what we don't like rather than marvel at how God is present to us and desires to transform us.
- We might be tempted to.....

Celebrating liturgy well takes a great deal of effort. It means that we come with the attitude that it is God alone whom we serve and this liturgy helps us do that better. At the same time, we must learn to be gentle with ourselves. When temptations come that entice us to focus on something other than worship of God, we simply pull ourselves back to the task at hand: giving ourselves over to God in thanksgiving and praise so God can transform us into ever more perfect members of the Body of Christ.

This single mom and her son continue making progress. The son is receiving much-needed help with his learning disability from the teachers and staff at his school. Getting better educational assistance for her son is the main reason this mom moved back from Puerto Rico to the States, where she was born. She feels she definitely made the right decision. She is appreciative that Catholic Charities and our parish are helping her and is committed to becoming independent and assisting other families in difficulty. With the determination she has shown so far, it is certain this will become a reality.

The single mom in this family had a difficult January. She lost her job because new management at her company changed her work schedule to the overnight shift. With two children under the age of four, and no child care available at night, she had to quit. Unfortunately she also lost her public aid benefits, and now has to reapply for them. Catholic Charities' case manager is working with her to have these benefits reactivated. In spite of these difficulties, this mom continues to attend her GED classes. She has been applying for jobs at various stores, gas stations and factories, and with the help of her job mentor, she is hopeful that she will be employed again shortly.

This mom is extremely grateful to the New Hope for Families program for "being there" for her and her children during this trying time.

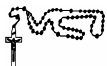
