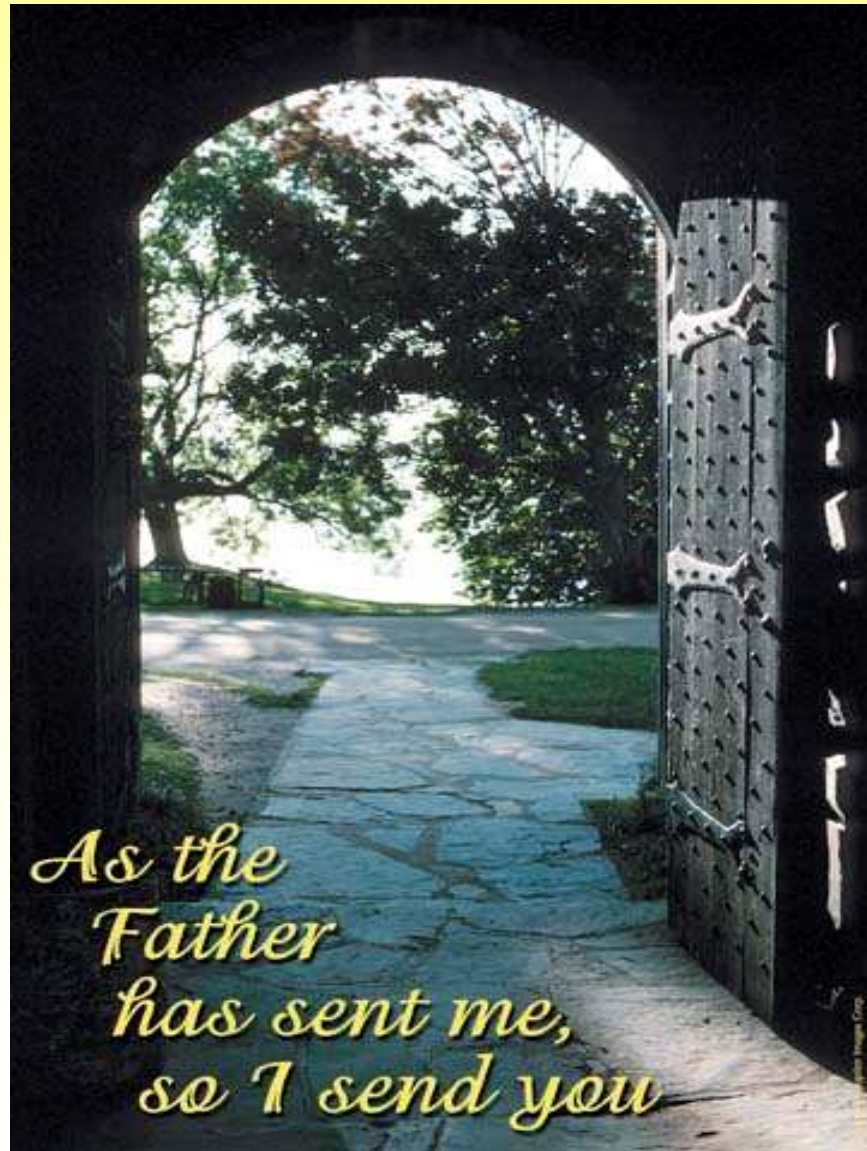

### Parishioner Questionnaire

The Strategic Planning Team is considering ways to provide St. Matthew parishioners with the option to make their financial offerings through an automated contribution service. This type of service has proven to be very popular in a number of parishes in the Archdiocese.

Parishioners who choose to sign up for an automated contribution service would no longer need to use envelopes for Sundays, Holy Days and other scheduled collections. They would have the convenience of electronically scheduling their offerings and having them deducted from their checking or savings accounts or major credit cards according to their preferences.

An automated contribution service is safe, easy to set up and provides parishioners the flexibility to control when and how much they donate and to make changes whenever and as often as they need. It would also benefit the Parish by providing a more predictable flow of revenue and increasing the overall level of contributions.

Before we decide whether or not to implement an automated contribution service, we need your input. At all masses next weekend, April 5-6, we will give you an opportunity to fill out the questionnaire below. The completed questionnaires will then be collected by the ushers. By responding to this questionnaire, you will not be obligated to participate in any automated contribution service that the Parish may choose to implement in the future.


Dear Pastor, parish Staff and Parishioners,

## **Chaplet of Divine Mercy**

Saint Faustina Kowalska was a Polish nun who received many messages from Jesus throughout her life, regarding His great mercy. He asked that the 1st Sunday after Easter be made a feast day focused on His Divine Mercy. On Divine Mercy Sunday, April 30, 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina and established this feast as Jesus had requested.

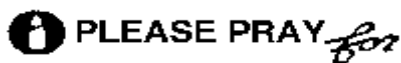
*Jesus told St. Faustina: "On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach My fountain of mercy. The souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment."*

*In addition, He gave us the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, to be prayed especially at the 3 o' clock hour in honor of His passion and death. Jesus also instructed St. Faustina to have an image painted of Him as the source of Divine Mercy as shown here.*

Note: Be sure to attend Mass beforehand, as we will not have Reconciliation or Sunday Mass at this event.

You can go to Reconciliation within 20 days before or after Divine Mercy Sunday. This would be a good time to fulfill your Easter duty by going to Reconciliation and Communion during Easter season.

**ANSWERS TO YOUR CATHOLIC IQ!!**

- 1) A) Shouts of “Hosanna!” (Matthew 21:9; Mark 11:9, John 12: 13) greeted Jesus’ entry into Jerusalem. “Hosanna” means “Save us, we pray!” The Gospel reading during the procession with palms on Palm Sunday is about Jesus’ entry into Jerusalem.
- 2) C) Zechariah (or Zachary) was the father of John the Baptist. After John’s birth Zechariah praised God in a song of praise called the “Canticle of Zechariah,” or the “Benedictus” (Luke 1:68-79) which is prayed each day by the Church as part of Morning Prayer.

**Taste ‘ n See Ya**

There is a very disturbing and unacceptable trend that is being practiced by too many Catholics, including our own parishioners and that is, to leave Mass immediately after receiving Holy Communion. Some people just leave at the start of communion, while others don't even break stride to stop for a moment of thanksgiving and personal reflection, but continue straight out the door while still consuming the Eucharist. This practice of self-dismissal shows a lack of understanding, respect and reverence for the real presence of Christ in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Exceptional circumstances may necessitate leaving early, but approximately one-fourth, of the Congregation at each Mass, each and every Sunday????

Each week we gather as a worshipping community to pray together in song and in word, and in some small way to get to know one another and support each other. This is a wonderful way to begin building an enduring community.
