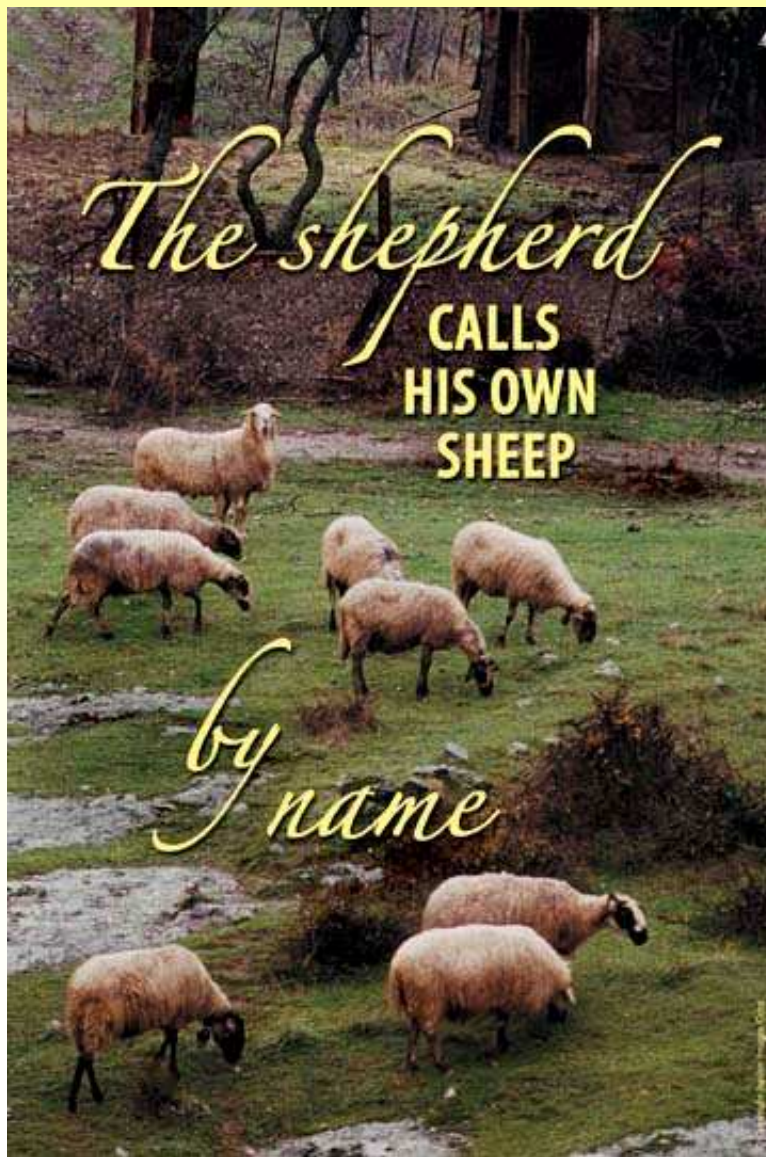

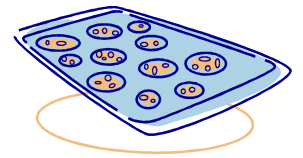

Family Cookie Project for Kairos Prison Ministry April 19-20th

Home-made cookies are a tangible expression of our care and concern for a group of people who have been put away in prison and who seldom encounter ours or God's love in their daily lives. As an expression of our concern for the residents in Stateville Correction Center in Joliet, Illinois, we are planning to flood the prison with home-made cookies as an expression of our care and concern.



How You Can Participate

We are inviting families and friends to spend some quality time together baking batches of cookies filled love and prayers. You can choose to bake Oatmeal, Peanut Butter, Chocolate Chip or Sugar Cookies or a few batches of each. We need at least 1000 cookies so the more you can bake the better. Cookies should be between 2 and 2½" in diameter. It's important not to use any icing or sugar coatings or to add any nuts or fruit to the recipe. Please be sure to cool the cookies totally and to bag them in a quart size zip-lock bag. Ask God to use your cookies to bring a little light and love to the residents and staff on the Kairos weekend retreat. Pray that your sacrifice brings the inmates and staff members closer to God.

This single mom in Family #12 is preparing for graduation from the New Hope Program the end of May. Prior to her coming into the New Hope Program, she owed a significant amount of money, but now she has paid off most of her debts and is almost debt-free. 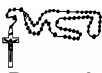
