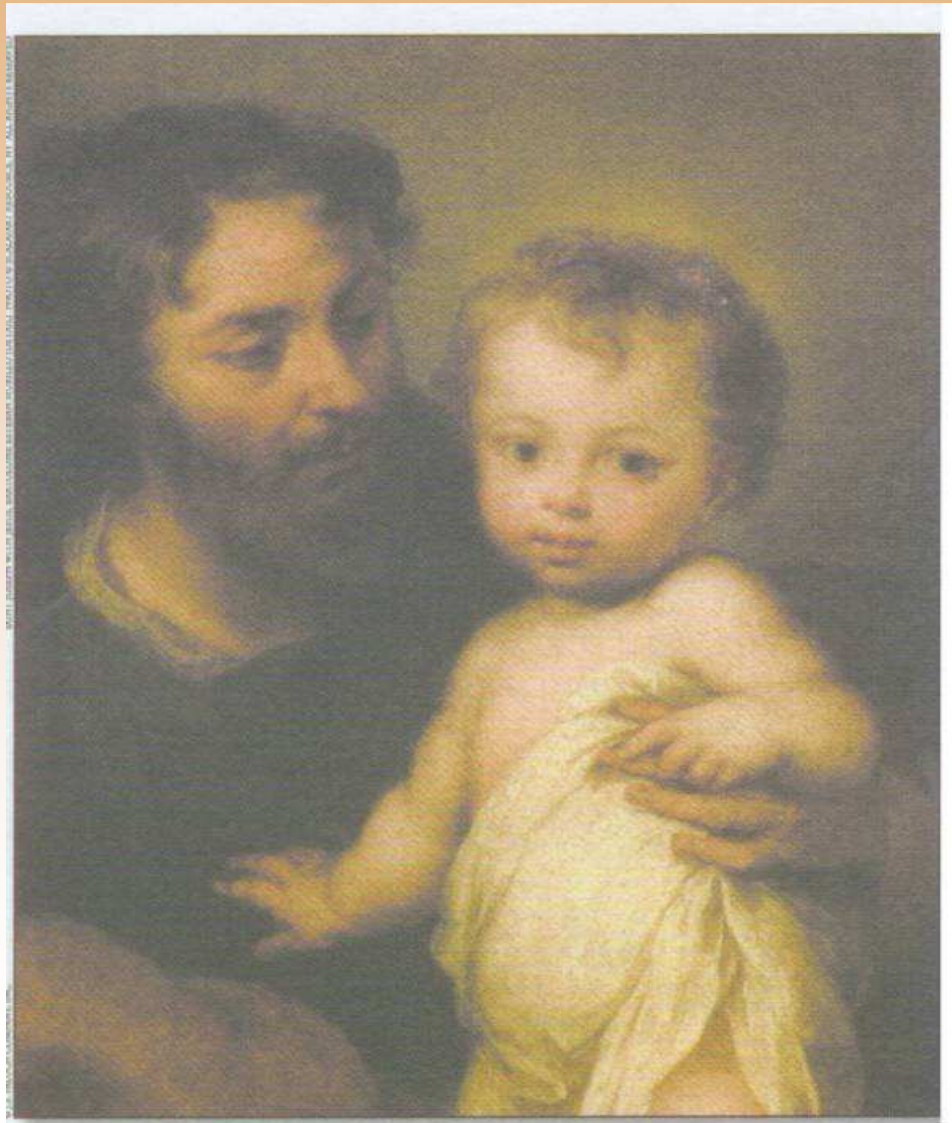

LABORERS NEEDED

Today's scriptures employ mixed metaphors--images of sheep and shepherds, priests and people, harvest and laborers--all of which intermingle to create a web of meaning on which we have based our understanding of Christian vocations. Above all, these images help us see Christian vocations as an extension and expression of Jesus' own ministry in the world. They lend themselves especially well to a reflection on the vocation to ordained priesthood. The scriptures for today help us understand the role of the ordained in the life of the Church. They also encourage us to pray for an increase in the number of candidates for priestly ordination, for "the harvest is abundant but the laborers are few" (Matthew 9:37).

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

If you could somehow transport a third-century Christian into your twenty-first-century Sunday Mass, once the initial shock wore off he or she would be more or less at home with the structure of the first part of the liturgy, the Word. The second part might be more difficult to comprehend. The stumbling block would be the book. We have a book, a missal or sacramentary, that is set down on the altar with a very precisely prescribed set of words for the priest to say and the people to sing at the Eucharistic Prayer. In the early days of the church, there were no set "formulas" for this prayer. The ancients would have raised eyebrows at our "bookishness" since they preferred to let the prayers roll forth from a gifted leader of prayer. There was a basic shape to the prayer of thanksgiving, and almost general agreement that the words of Christ at the Last Supper ought to be included.

By the second century, Justin Martyr wrote that the presider "gives thanks at some length . . . and when he has finished the prayers and the thanksgiving, all the people present give their assent by saying 'Amen.' " In the world before books, people could memorize long passages of prose and poetry, and so it is easy to see how particular phrases or expressions passed from church to church.

NEW HOPE FOR FAMILIES UPDATE

Family #11 has moved one step up in our program. This single mother has been working hard on goals that are pivotal to achieving financial independence. This single mom is currently working full-time with a medical supply company and earning a regular salary, but it is not yet enough to "make it on her own". She has moved to the second stage of the New Hope program, in which she will pay a larger share of her expenses. Catholic Charities staff will continue to work with this mom until she is able to sustain her family.

Catholic Charities joins this single mom to extend our appreciation to our parish partners for their support of the program.

And for our Family #12, it is graduation time! They have participated in our program since June of 2007. This single mother came in the program with a lot of stress regarding her unemployment and her son's poor academic performance. Catholic Charities staff worked with this mom to find employment and become self-sufficient.

She accomplished all the goals she set for herself during her time in the New Hope program. Her son's performance in school improved significantly. He was able to obtain a GPA of 2.50 which is two times better than his performance prior to their admittance in the program. Meanwhile, the mother got a job with a real estate company as a property manager and she is now making more than 1½ times the minimum wage. This single mom is graduating from the program with three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) in her savings.

She, too, extends her sincere gratitude to our parish partners for their invaluable assistance to her family. She hopes with God's continued blessings she will be able to extend a helping hand to someone else in the future.
