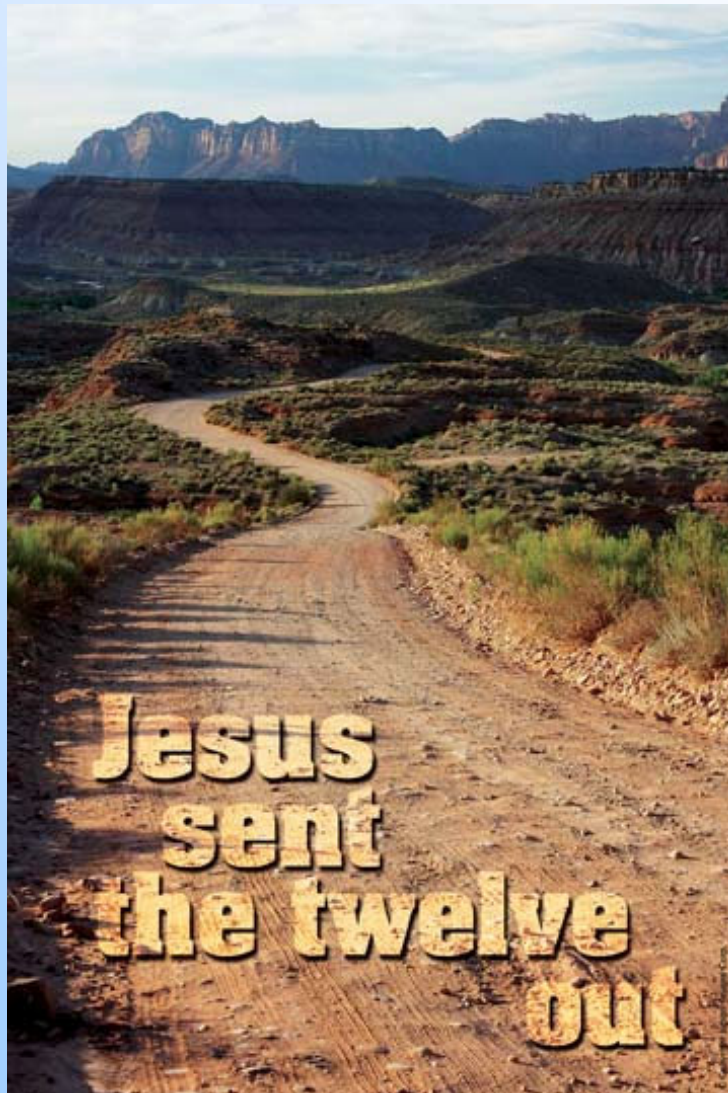

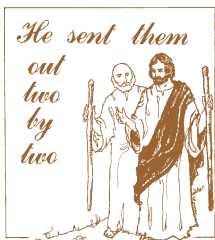


## CELEBRATION OF COMMUNAL ANOINTING

**SATURDAY, JULY 25, 2009**  
**DURING THE 5:00 pm Mass in the Church**

The Sacrament of Anointing is a special opportunity for the Lord's healing power to touch those who are experiencing an illness or the aging process. Any person afflicted with an illness, or aware of the limitations inherent in aging, is eligible for the Sacrament. The elderly, major surgery anticipants, post-surgical patients, heart and stroke patients-as well as those experiencing emotional or physical distress are especially welcome.

St. Matthew invites all who are suffering to share Christ's presence and peace in this manner.



## CALLED BY GOD

Today's scriptures invite us to listen to two calls. The first is the call issued by the Lord to the prophet Amos, the "shepherd and a dresser of sycamores" (Amos 7:14). The second is the call the Lord Jesus issued to the Twelve, whom he sent out "two by two" (Mark 6:7). These faithful people responded to the call, prophesying and preaching to the people to whom they had been sent. Each of us received a call when we were baptized. The second reading invites us to ponder that call as we are reminded that we are chosen in Christ and that, in love, God "destined us for adoption" (Ephesians 1:5). As adopted daughters and sons of God we are called to bring the presence of Christ into our marriages, families, schools, and places of work. Let us be inspired today to say "yes" to the call we hear once again through God's living word.

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## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

At the time of the Reformation, although England broke away from papal authority under Henry VIII, a silent majority clung to the Catholic faith. Henry's eldest daughter, Mary, restored the "old religion" in a fierce persecution of Protestants (she is called "Bloody Mary" for good reason.) His youngest daughter, Elizabeth, rejected papal ties. Under her reign, beginning with legislation in 1593, Catholics were persecuted again, and only the very wealthy could afford the fines for not attending Anglican services on Sunday. They were called "recusants," from a Latin word meaning "refuse," since they refused to attend the liturgy of the Church of England. Many families maintained Catholic tradition in secret, and today their descendants claim "Recusancy" as a mark of family pride. For generations they sent their young people abroad to be educated in convents and monasteries. It is not surprising that the first monastery in colonial America springs from Holland with the daughters of patrician English recusant families. Port Tobacco, Maryland, proved fruitful soil for the Carmelite tradition.

## What is Ministry?

According to Webster, one of the definitions of the term ministry is: “a person or thing through which something is accomplished”. In this definition, ministry is an instrument or tool through which something else is accomplished. Although this is a secular definition of the term, and is being used to define ministry as a noun (an object), it does have interesting implications for us as Catholic Christians. Ministry is the conduit through which something else is accomplished. As Catholic Christians, that “something else” is God’s Kingdom. When we consider ministry in this sense, it raises several interesting points. In ministry, we are the instruments through which something else is accomplished. It isn’t about us. Rather it’s about us using the gifts we have received through God’s grace in service of God’s Kingdom.



Ministry is always other-focused and requires us to place ourselves in the role of servant. Perhaps the clearest image we have of this is Jesus’ washing the feet of the apostles at the Last Supper. He takes on a role of the lowliest of servants and freely performs a task that could not even be required of the lowest servant; it is the task of a slave: kneeling at the feet of another to wash their feet. This takes on additional significance in that He also washed the feet of His betrayer. He didn’t choose who to serve; rather He served the ones in His midst.

Rev. Thomas O’Meara, OP, an emeritus professor of theology at Notre Dame University, provides a challenging statement in his theology of ministry. He says: “If everything’s ministry then nothing is ministry”. He challenges us to take a serious look at what we mean when we use the term ministry. If what we’re doing isn’t being done in the name of the Church and in service to Christ, then it isn’t ministry. O’Meara goes on to indicate that it doesn’t mean that what is being done isn’t of value; just that it isn’t ministry. What matters is whether or not the action is done in service to the other, which is also in service to Christ.

In order for something to be a ministry, it must be done publicly and be of service to others with the ultimate goal being working towards God’s Kingdom. It is the community that determines who is the minister: it is not a title that any person can choose for themselves; there is no degree program that can confer the title, rather it is given by the community being served. Consider for a moment the ordination ceremony of priest. It isn’t done in secret, but rather is a very public, community event. The candidate is presented to the bishop, and makes a public declaration of their dedication to the service of Christ in His Church. They are called forth from the community and placed in service of the community.

Ministry is always about service to others. It constantly challenges us to move beyond our comfort zones and to truly be persons for others. Ministry beckons us to enter ever more deeply into the Paschal Mystery as we die to ourselves that we might serve others; that we might allow Christ the opportunity to transform our lives as we put ourselves aside in service of God’s Kingdom.

In First Corinthians 12: 27-30, Paul challenges us to consider how we are called to serve. “Now you are Christ’s body, and individually parts of it. Some people God has designated in the church to be, first, apostles; second, prophets; third, teachers; then, mighty deeds; then, gifts of healing, assistance, administration, and varieties of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work mighty deeds? Do all have gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret?” Paul clearly reminds us that each of us is given different gifts that might be put in service of the Kingdom. All of the gifts we’ve been given have value and need to be used in service of the common good.

Each of us has been given gifts and graces by God that we are called by our Baptism to place in service of God’s Kingdom. What gifts have I been given? How am I placing myself in service of others? How am I answering the mission given to me at my Baptism and in each Eucharistic celebration to “go forth and make disciples of all nations”?
